
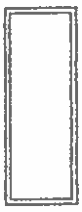

This property is located in rural Jefferson County, southwest of the county seat of Charles Town.

Description of Buildings or Site (Original and Present)	_____ 2 _____ Stories _____ 7 _____ Front Bays
This is substantial Federal-style Palladian home with a central hipped-roofed structure with flanking side wings of dissimilar size. The three-bay facade of the central section incorporates a centered entrance with a semi-elliptical fanlight and sidelights, shield by a pedimented Doric portico of a design seen elsewhere on similarly-crafted Jefferson County plantation seats. Above the front door is a second-story window motif with a standard double-hung window flanked by double-hung half-wide sash. Large brick chimneys rise through the hipped roof.

Agricultural dependencies dot the landscape including sheds and stables for the horse farm which the house now anchors. Along Earle Road is a stone ruin including a chimney which may have been a dependency associated with "Cedar Lawn."

Statement of Significance	
Another of Jefferson County's Washington plantation houses, this house was erected in 1825 by John Thornton Augustine Washington, II (d. 1841), grandson of Samuel Washington. The property remained in the Washington family until 1855. The 1883 S. Howell Brown map of Jefferson County identifies it as being owned by Robert Earl. Earle Road, with an "c," likely bears his name. The property is individually listed in the National Register.
