This property is located in rural Jefferson County, south of the county seat of Charles Town.

This is a substantial Georgian-style residence of limestone with a truncated hipped roof penetrated by large chimneys and capped with a balustrade. The three-bay facade includes an elaborate entryway with sidelights and transom sash, shielded by a flat-roofed portico with a second-story balustrade. Centered in on the facade on the second story is a window unit including a conventional double-hung center section and more narrow sidelights, a design characteristic seen elsewhere in Jefferson County. Flanking the original building are one-story brick additions, with laterally-oriented gable roofs dating from the 1960's.

Several agricultural outbuildings are located adjacent to the house including a new storage building with metal siding, a metal corn crib, and a large historic bank barn with limestone foundation.

Statement of Significance

"Eastwood" was erected by John Gantt between 1776 and 1795. It may be eligible for the National Register under Criterion C for architecture, as a well-preserved Jefferson County Federal-style limestone farmhouse dating from the late eighteenth century. However, its brick additions may have compromised its integrity.
