This is a substantial and imposing stone house with a 5-bay facade and centered entry, indicative of a central-passage interior plan. The entrance on the facade is shielded by a handsome Classical Revival-style 1-story pedimented portico with a wrought iron balustrade and paired Doric columns. Fenestration is flat-topped with 8/12 sash.

"Elmwood," was built by Edward Lucas, III, whose father, Edward Lucas, II came to the area from Bucks County, Pennsylvania in 1732. Edward Lucas, III was a Revolutionary War soldier who, among other assignments, served as a second lieutenant in Capt. William Morgan's company which reinforced George Washington's forces at Morristown, New Jersey. His son, Edwards Lucas, inherited the estate and lived here(the "s" was added to his name at the time of his birth after two earlier sons named Edward died infancy), followed by his son, Robert Lucas, a Civil war-era physician who allowed the family home to be used as a field hospital. "Elmwood" is individually listed in the National Register. It is among Jefferson County's finest rural country homes. (Use Continuation Sheets)
