Gap View Farm was built c. 1770 by John Baker (d. 1798), a Tory during the American Revolution. He was married to Judith Wood (1733-1805), daughter of Sir Henry Howard, Duke of Norfolk. This property appears to meet National Register Criterion C for architecture, as a well-preserved nineteenth-century rural Jefferson County I-house, although an inspection of the interior would be required to confirm this determination. An Internet website, archiplanet.org, identifies Charles Baker as the architect of a 1937 Colonial Revival-style project associated with the property, perhaps the addition. Gap View is listed individually in the National Register. (Use Continuation Sheets)
