




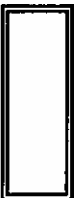

Fenestration flat-topped. With multi-light sash and exterior operable louvered wood shutters. Windows are capped with jack-arched lintels.

Statement of Significance

"Glenburnie" was built by Capt. James William Glenn, whose father, William, had been paying rent to Lord Fairfax as early as 1770. Glenn served in the American Revolution and later built this home, where he reared his family, including a daughter, who would become the mother of the Confederate spy, Belle Boyd of Martinsburg. In 1886 the house was sold by former Confederate Captain James W. Glenn and in 1920, the property was purchased by Gilbert H. Hendricks, in whose family it remains. "Glenburnie" is individually listed in the National Register.
