<p>This is a 3-bay brick house with flanking temple-form side wings linked by laterally-oriented gable-roofed connectors, more characteristic of the Georgian style. Windows are flat-topped, 6/6, and a stepped brick cornice appears under the eaves. The main entrance is centered on the facade and features a transom sash and sidelights. Centered on the roof of the facade is a pediment with a semi-elliptical lunette. Statement of Significance	<p>This property was investigated in the course of the Section 106 review of the Route 340 improvement project. The house occupies a tract acquired John Gantt. David Hefleblower purchased the land from John Gantt, Jr. and in 1846 sold this tract to Charles S. Taylor; tax records for 1846 under Taylor's ownership indicate an increase of "\$2,132 added for a new house." It was determined eligible for the National Register by the West Virginia Division of Culture and History (the SHPO) in a January 7, 2000 letter to the WV Division of Highways.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>(Use Continuation Sheets)</i></p>
