| Statement of Significance This property appears to meet National Register Criterion A for its association with the Jefferson County orchard industry and Criterion C for architecture, although an inspection of the interior would be required to confirm this determination. It is part of one of the five divisions of Robert Throckmorton's Roxton Estate; the original house, not extant, was near the Clark County, Virginia line. With respect to the subject property, in 1845 Throckmorton's great-nephew, John Thomson, built a stone addition to the original log house; eventually the roof was raised and the present gambrel roof was the result. The property remained in the family for generations and was home to community leaders and to Augustus Pembroke Thomson, a cadet at the Virginia Military Institute in 1864 who marched to the battle of New Market.
