




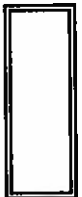

A variety of agricultural dependencies dots the cultural landscape, including a substantial timber frame bank barn, various sheds, and outbuildings of indeterminate age and usage. All are of wood construction.

Statement of Significance	
This property appears to meet National Register Criterion A for <i>agriculture</i> and Criterion C for <i>architecture</i> , as a nineteenth-century Jefferson County farmstead anchored by a brick I-house. An inspection of the interior of the house would be required to confirm this determination. Signage along the road indicates this to be a National Bicentennial Farm, indicating that the property has been in the ownership of the same family for at least 200 years.
