



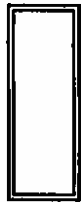

This is a well-preserved and substantial Federal-style limestone central-passage double-pile rural residence, with a laterally-oriented gable roof and 5-bay facade with a centered entry. The entry is distinguished by an opening with a semi-elliptical fanlight and sidelights. Fenestration is flat-topped, with multi-light sash and exterior operable louvered wood shutters. Windows capped with jack-arch lintels. Interior gable-end stone chimneys and side elevations penetrated by windows. 2-story wood addition at rear, appearing to date from within the assumed period of significance. of the property.
