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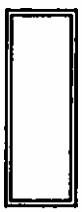

Vernacular residence of wood construction, appearing to have been built in several stages. The building is capped with a laterally-oriented gable roof penetrated on the facade by a shallow offset gable with a shingled pediment and a single-light "Queen Anne" window. Fenestration flat-topped, generally 2/2, with simple molded heads and exterior operable louvered wood shutters. A porch extends across that facade. Exterior gable-end chimneys of stone and brick.
