A Late Victorian-era veranda extends along the rear elevation, which is also 5 bays in width with a centered door corresponding to that on the facade. On the second story above both the front and back doors is a window motif incorporating a conventional double-hung sash flanked by double-hung windows c. one-half size in width. This motif is seen elsewhere in Jefferson County and may represent the work of a particular builder. Fenestration is flat-topped, with multi-light sash and the hipped roof is penetrated by brick chimneys and gable dormers. Hammond who moved here from "Happy Retreat," the Charles Washington House. This property replaced the home of Thomas, lord Fairfax.
