This is an outstanding Greek Revival-style residence with a symmetrically-massed 3-bay facade with a broad veranda and porte-cochere. Fenestration is flat-topped throughout, with exterior operable wood shutters. The building is capped with a shallow-pitched hipped roof penetrated by dormers. Placement of the chimneys suggests that the interior is arranged on a central-passage, double-pile plan.

Robert Jacks built "Vinton" c. 1840. His daughter, Rebecca, married Thomas Manning, and the property has been associated with the Manning family ever since. Orchards originally surrounded the property and for a time the Mannings had a race track behind the house. "Vinton" is listed individually in the National Register.
