This property is located in rural Jefferson County, south of the county seat of Charles Town.

This is a substantial residence of brick construction which was erected in several sections, evidenced by the location of the chimneys which penetrate the roof line at irregular intervals. The laterally-oriented roof is of standing-seam metal and the facade incorporates a broad verandah which extends across its entire length, supported by wood posts. Fenestration is flat-topped, with multi-light sash, some of which retains historic wood shutters. Paired windows are in the pediments of the gable ends. One-story additions are at the rear.

Dependencies include several outbuilding of agricultural use, all of wood frame construction, including one small barn set on a foundation of coursed rubble limestone and a log servants' quarters and kitchen.

Statement of Significance

Daniel Heflebower acquired this land from John Gantt and in 1814 built the first section of this substantial property..Later additions were made in 1829 and in the 1860s. This was the site of an 1864 Civil War skirmish and was evaluated in the course of a Section 106 review of the proposed Route 340 project. It was determined eligible for the National Register by the West Virginia Division of Culture and History (the SHPO) in a January 7, 2000 letter to the WV Division of Highways.
