Statement of Significance	
Built by Hugh Nelson Pendleton who had acquired the land from the McCormick heirs in 1847. Sold by the Pendeltons to Robert Owen Allen in 1871. The property appears eligible for the National Register under Criterion C for <i>architecture</i> as a locally-distinctive interpretation of the upright-with-wings house type. The 1883 S. Howell Brown map of Jefferson County indicates this to have been the home of R. O. Allen at that time.
