This property is located in rural Jefferson County, northeast of the unincorporated village of Leetown. Gravel parking areas surround portions of the property.

This is a substantial Federal-style building built on a raised foundation providing it with an even more substantial appearance. The building incorporates a laterally-oriented gable roof penetrated by segmental-arched dormers and incorporating a stepped parapet gabled finish to each gable end. The facade is symmetrically massed, five bays in width, with a centered entrance. The arrangement of the fenestration suggests that the interior is arranged around a four-over-four central passage plan. A one-bay porch is on the facade and a 4-bay veranda on the rear elevation. Fenestration is flat-topped, with some multi-light sash retained. Some windows have operable exterior wood shutters.

Statement of Significance

One of Jefferson County's premiere early 19th-century rural homes, "Woodbury" was built in 1835 by Henry St. George Tucker, a federal judge who had established a law school at Winchester, Virginia and married Ann Stephen Dandridge Hunter, whose home was at nearby "Hazelfield." The Tuckers occupied "Woodbury" until 1844 when Judge Tucker was appointed to the law faculty of the University of Virginia. The building is individually listed in the National Register.
