The Jefferson County Landmarks Commission met on November 11th at 10:00 a.m. in the offices of the Planning Commission. Those present were Miss Stanley, Mrs. Riely, Dr. Washington, Capt. Schley and Mr. Franzen.

A general discussion of roadside signs, having to do with sites and structures of Bi-centennial importance took place. Springdale and Beverly were suggested and their owner's approval will be sought before proceeding to order them. Other sites and structures are to be considered with a total limitation of ten signs.

The next order of business was the selection of four additional sites to inspect. It was tentatively suggested that the Darke Slave Quarters and Cemetery be visited. Other homes mentioned were those of R.L. Jones, Mrs. Irene Moore and Asten Pool Farm owned by Mr. Prinz.

Capt. Schley will order twelve bronze plaques with but two bolt holes for fastening in mortar joints to avoid drilling into stone or brick.

The corrected by-laws and constitution submitted by Miss Stanley were approved by all Commission members.

The next meeting to inspect additional sites is called for next Monday, November 18th.
