The Jefferson County Landmarks Commission met at the Planning Commission's Office on November 25th 1974 at 10:00 a.m. Those present were Dr. Washington, Miss Emily Stanley, Capt. John Schley, and Mr. Archie Franzen. Mrs. Riely was unable to attend.

Miss Stanley suggested that a state information road marker be installed in the vicinity of the site of General Darke's home.

Bob Beckett joined the group for the purpose of discussing the new zoning ordinance now in preparation. He brought out the need for incorporating protection for historic structures. He said a zoning report and maps would be completed by the latter part of January and that ten public hearings are planned.

There would be a referendum after the zoning ordinance was adopted by the County Court. The Commission adopted Mr. Beckett's historic place provisions with corrections.

Dr. Washington reported that Miss Crane had resigned as typist for the commission.

Capt. Schley reported that he had ordered twelve of the bronze plaques. He also presented a draft of a form to be used for the Register. In addition Capt. Schley volunteered to start writing letters to owners of properties meriting landmark status. The following six places to be the first to be accorded this distinction.
