The first meeting of the Jefferson County Landmarks Commission was held at 10:00 a.m., Monday, March the 18th (in the Jefferson County Planning Commission's Office). Those present were Miss Emily Stanley, Mrs. Leeds K. Riely, Dr. John Washington, Capt. John Schley and Mr. Archie Franzen.

Mrs. Raymond Parks and Mr. Robert Beckett of the Jefferson County Planning Commission sat in on the meeting and the group was later joined by Dr. O.C. Stine.

The first order of business was the elction of officers as stipulated by the Jefferson County Court. Dr. Washington acted as temporary chairman during the selection of officers. Dr. Washington was chosen president; Hr. Franzen, secretary and Capt. Schley, treasurer.

The next order of business was the working up of a budget for fiscal year 1975. Various anticipated expenses of the Commission were discussed and Capt. Schley, treasurer was to assemble data for submission to the County Court.
