The Jefferson County Landmarks Commission assembled at Miss Stanley's home at 9:30 a.m. on Monday, May 12th. Those present were Miss Stanley, Mrs. Riely, Dr. Washington, Capt. Schley and Mr. Franzen.

The purpose of assembling was to tour the following houses to determine their possible revolutionary war period existence.

First visited was an out-building at "Happy Retreat". The stone portion could well have been built prior to 1776. Mrs. Gavin was kind enough to take the committee through the building.

The next structure visited was the stone farm house at Asten Pool Farm. This structure had previously been visited but at that time it had not been possible to look at the interior. The owner, Mr. Printz, met the Commission and conducted the members through the house. Parts of the interior fabric could well date back to pre-revolutionary times. Mr. Printz will try to find supporting historical data to date the house.

The Commission next visited a two story log structure on the farm of the Renaud family. This vacant structure was remodelled over the years leaving only recent stylistic features that are identifiable. The basic earlier log construction could be of a very early vintage with no fixed date provable.
